ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2019

Background

Emergency Chaplains was founded in 2008 to serve First Responders and citizens in crisis in Durham, NC.

Today, we have 3 full-time employees who manage 61 volunteer Chaplains across 12 counties in North Carolina.

38 Public Safety agencies are currently served through our ministry.



Our Mission

"We build caring relationships with the hope of gaining permission to share the life changing Good News of Jesus Christ in a non-threatening manner."

Our chaplains accomplish this by ministering to Law Enforcement Officers, Firefighters, Medics and 9-1-1 Communicators while serving side-by-side with them to care for people in difficult times.



In 2019, our CRT Chaplains responded to 403 crisis calls from Public Safety Agencies to provide assistance for citizens. 303 of those calls involved sudden, unexpected death.

In 2019, our Chaplains reported 536 care sessions, 658 station visits and 159 ride alongs. They logged almost 3,000 hours of direct contact with First Responders.

Over 2,500 First Responders now have access to one or more of our Chaplains. These First Responders provide service to more than 1 million citizens.

Emergency Chaplains is a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation registered in the state of North Carolina. The ministry does not charge for services and does not request funding from the Public Safety Agencies served. Funding is provided primarily by donations from individuals and churches.

The Future

Our vision is to recruit, train, qualify and mentor Chaplain prospects across North Carolina. Trained Chaplains will be prayerfully matched to a Public Safety Agency in their area, resulting in a sustainable network of qualified Chaplains in all 100 counties of the state.

We have developed our own training and certification program for Chaplains that is launching this month. Our goal is to train and certify 500 Chaplains for service in North Carolina over the next 5 years.
