

# **Hurricane Helene Recovery:** The Work is Just Beginning

Recovery efforts are ongoing in the areas devastated by Hurricane Helene. The death toll in North Carolina has climbed to 73, with hundreds more still unaccounted for. Sadly, the number of lives lost is expected to rise as search teams reach the most destroyed and remote areas.

Additionally, two of our chaplains were directly in the path of the storm. We've been in contact with Chaplain Steve Newton in Hendersonville, who has even assisted us in locating family members of one of our ministry partners. We were also able to reach Chaplain Johnny Hewett in Yancey County by text. Johnny and his wife, Connie, are safe, but they live in one of the hardest hit, more isolated areas. Their region received over 20 inches of rain and faced hurricane strength winds, resulting in extensive damage. Several roads have been washed out, and bridges destroyed.

The road to recovery will be long. Some places won't fully rebuild for months, maybe even years. One of the best ways you can help is by supporting groups that not only rush in to provide relief during the disaster but also stick around for the long haul. One of these groups is NC Baptists on Mission.

## **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

#### Do not be anxious about anything... Philippians 4:6a

Needless to say, our upcoming banquet is at the very top of my list of things to share with you. To be honest, banquet time always gives me a lot of anxiety. It feels



like planning a huge dinner party for hundreds of guests that I need to impress. And it's even more stressful when many of those guests have attended before, so I know this year's event has to be even better than the last!

I probably put more pressure on myself than I should, but the banquet is a big deal to me. It's not about impressing you with fancy food or a flashy program. I have just one goal: to help you fall in love with Emergency Chaplains. Each year, we give our banquet guests a small glimpse into the enormous and fertile mission field that God has called us to. It's a field we love deeply, and we want you to love it, too.

Since 2008, Carter, Carl, and I have poured our hearts into EChap, growing and expanding the ministry. For the first seven years, we didn't even take a salary. The Lord provided for our family while growing support for the

ministry, allowing us to build financial reserves that enabled us to hire Dylan Stone full-time.

A lot has happened since then, but one of the most exciting things has been the creation of our own training and certification program. Today, we have 94 members and 258 people who have completed our Core Training. I mentioned these numbers in our last newsletter, along with the fact that we haven't yet reached our goals. I ended last month by talking about how this work—these numbers and our presence in 25 counties—represents "laying the foundation" for a ministry built to last, for God's glory.

But the big question is: where do we go from here? Are we satisfied with just building a strong foundation? I'm not. Foundations are meant to be built on, not to be places where we settle down and stop growing. That's what I want to communicate in this last quarter of 2024: we need your help to build on the foundation that the Lord has so graciously provided!

To move to the next level, we need to fund two part-time administrative positions. With over 90 members and 258 students, Dylan and I are spending way too much time on administrative work when we should be focused on recruiting new chaplains, building relationships with agencies, and developing training material. To make this happen, we need to raise an additional \$50,000 each year to cover the cost of these two part-time administrative roles.

I'm praying that we can fund these positions for next year through donations and pledges at our banquet on October 24th. Please pray for me—that I'll be able to clearly communicate this need in these final months of 2024—and pray for God's people to respond generously, so we can continue to grow our team of God-fearing, Biblebelieving, Jesus-following chaplains in the years to come.
