The Family Life Center at **Grey Stone Baptist Church** in Durham was the setting for our first annual Hometown Heroes Banquet on November 4th. Over 350 people gathered to show appreciation to men and women who have dedicated their lives to serving us and to honor them for going above and beyond the call of duty to be peacemakers in our community.

Our guests were treated to a delicious meal from **Home Plate Restaurant** in Durham and some fantastic desserts donated by **Cakes** by **Faith**.

Following dinner, each award winner was introduced by a video presentation and presented with a plaque recognizing them for their selfless service to the people of our community.

Chaplain Jeff DeGrow of Emergency Chaplains was our keynote speaker. Everyone's attention was fixed on Jeff as he shared his story of how he survived being ambushed while serving with the Charleston County (SC) Sheriff's Office. During a foot chase, Jeff was shot six times by the suspect that he was chasing. One of the bullets entered Jeff's eye, broke his jaw and lodged near his ear.

Although Jeff is now blind in his right eye and has medically retired from Law Enforcement, he knows that God spared his life that day for a reason. Now called to prepare for ministry, Jeff and his wife, Lisa, moved to the Raleigh area where he currently attends The College at Southeastern Seminary in Wake Forest and serves as a Chaplain for the Franklin County Sheriff's Office and Youngsville Fire Department.

BRANTLEY PEARCE MEMORIAL

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. (2 Corinthians 1:3-4)

On August 28, 2012, 18 year old Brantley Pearce, died in an automobile accident. Brantley's best friend, Miles Moorman also died in the accident. Two other friends in the car were injured.

Recalling the night of the accident Brantley's mother, Karen, wrote, "Every community needs a chaplain who takes care of people the way Emergency Chaplains does. No one should ever have to be alone when something like this happens."

This memorial has been established by Brantley's family out of the pain caused by his loss. They want this memorial to be a testimony of their faith in Jesus Christ, acknowledging that He is the source of their comfort, strength and hope. They want others who are suffering in the midst of crisis to be offered the same hope and comfort they have.

As Emergency Chaplains works to establish a chaplaincy presence in every county in North Carolina,

this memorial fund will be used to provide training for those chaplains. Our goal is to produce an army of chaplains across our state who are always ready to take the comfort of Christ to those in crisis.

Steve Kincaid (Sr. Medic) and Mike Smith (Director) of Durham EMS received the first Brantley Pearce Memorial Awards at the Hometown Heroes Banquet on November 4th.

Kincaid was chosen because of his dedication to Emergency Medicine and for providing his patients and their families with extraordinary care and compassion. Smith was recognized for his commitment to providing chaplaincy care for his employees and the people of Durham County and for his visionary leadership in the establishment of Emergency Chaplains.
