CHAPLAIN FIELD REPORTS



Roxboro PD Chief David Hess and Chaplain Ed Miller met the community at an ice cream event in Roxboro on August 23rd. Ed completed his Public Safety Chaplaincy Certification through EChap in 2021 and now serves Roxboro PD and is part of our Person County Crisis Response Team.

MANY INCIDENTS PERSONALLY AFFECT FIRST

RESPONDERS. Following a critical incident in the jail involving an inmate that attempted suicide, a Chaplain was requested to assist jail staff and deputies. The inmate was resuscitated and transported to the hospital. The Chaplain was able to counsel and pray for 8 of the staff members that were involved, including the detention officer who found the inmate.

WHILE DRIVING HOME, A CHAPLAIN SPOTTED A STATE

TROOPER sitting in a parking lot. The Chaplain decided to stop by and introduce himself to the trooper. Their conversation revealed that they had met working a death scene together a few months prior. The Trooper shared about struggles in their life, and that they appreciated a listening ear. Thankfully this Chaplain followed the Lord's prompting to stop and talk with this trooper!

CHAPLAIN RESPONDED TO A CALL AFTER A 12-YEAR-OLD COMMITTED SUICIDE. Chaplain followed up with family, medics, officers, and firefighters. CHAPLAIN REQUESTED TO ASSIST AT THE SCENE OF A PEDESTRIAN STRUCK by a vehicle on the interstate after their car had broken down. Patient was pronounced dead on scene. Chaplain ministered to family and friends that witnessed the incident and assisted them with the next steps.

EMS ASKED FOR A CHAPLAIN TO ASSIST WITH A PATIENT

experiencing an elevated level of stress. The patient had recently had multiple deaths in their family. The Chaplain simply provided a listening ear and was able to pray with them.
