CHAPLAINS NOW SERVING CARY FIRE DEPARTMENT

After more than a year of planning and recruiting, Emergency Chaplains began serving the Cary Fire Department this past May.

Cary FD employs 225 men and women who work together to serve the more than 141,000 citizens who live there. The firefighters cover more than 55 square miles that comprise the Town of Cary out of eight strategically located stations.

The department is led by Chief Allan Cain.

PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Every crisis matters. That's what we believe at Emergency Chaplains and it's the driving force behind our ministry. Our heart is to meet people in crisis and take the comfort of Christ to them right where they are.



It takes a lot more than just a few chaplains to carry out the ministry before us. As a matter of fact, it takes a team of people dedicated to the cause. Not everyone is called to be a chaplain but everyone can be a part of the team that cares for our First Responders and comforts people who are often facing the most difficult day of their lives.

Our priority goals for 2013 are to start a **Grief Ministry Team** and to expand our **Crisis Response Team**. Starting these teams hinges on raising enough support to cover our office costs and to add a couple of part time employees.

A good part of our office costs have been taken care of through donated space that we will tell you about in our next newsletter. Continue to pray and consider giving to help us raise the needed support to start these important ministries in our community.

Also, we want you to consider how you can be a part of our team. Here are a few ideas of Partnership Opportunities that we have available:

PRAYER TEAM

As a Prayer Team member you will be assigned a local First Responder who has asked to be prayed for. Your assignment will be to pray for your First Responder, by name, on a daily basis. We will also give you a mailing address where you can send notes of encouragement, birthday cards, holiday wishes, etc...

OFFICE VOLUNTEER

Some examples of assistance that we will need:

- writing newsletters, brochures, training materials
- general office help (errands, stuffing envelopes, making phone calls)
- administrative support for our Chaplains, Crisis and Grief Teams.

CHAPLAIN

We will always have a need for experienced Chaplains and Pastors to join our ranks. At the same time, we are also willing to train those who believe that the Lord has called them to serve as a Public Safety Chaplain.

CRISIS RESPONSE TEAM

This team will respond to assist citizens at the time of crisis. The majority of calls for service will be to assist family and loved ones on the scene of a sudden, unexpected death. Our desire is to respond, 24/7, to every death call in the county. Volunteers will respond in pairs. Dozens of volunteers are needed. Training will be provided.

GRIEF MINISTRY TEAM

This team will provide continuing care for family and loved ones that our Crisis Response Team helps. Some of the duties will be: Help with funeral, follow up visits, writing cards and letters, grief counseling and support groups. In addition to servicing the loved ones that our CRT has worked with, this team will also search local obituaries and public records in order to contact others who are experiencing grief. Dozens of volunteers will be needed for this team and training will be provided. Volunteers may take part in one or more duties within this ministry.



MONTHLY COMFORTER

Monthly financial support of the ministry will help assure that we have the ongoing resources to "take the presence of Christ to those in crisis".
